SPEECH BY MR. YATIMAN YUSOF, SENIOR PARLIAMENTARY SECRETARY (INFORMATION AND THE ARTS) AND MP FOR TAMPINES GRC, AT THE CLOSING CEREMONY OF THE TEMASEK POLYTECHNIC MALAY CULTURAL WEEK AT TEMASEK POLYTECHNIC ON
