SPEECH BY MR OTHMAN HARON EUSOFE, MINISTER OF STATE FOR MANPOWER AND MP FOR MARINE PARADE GRC AT THE LAUNCHING OF THE TABUNG AMAL AIDIL FITRI'S CHARITY BOXES ON WED, 29 NOV 2000 AT 4 PM AT TG KATONG COMPLEX
