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Opening Address By MG Lim Kim Choon, Chief of Air Force, at the Opening Ceremony of Exercise Cope Tiger 2004

This level of participation demonstrates the enthusiasm and commitment by all three forces in the Cope Tiger series of exercise. The CPX and FTX promise excellent learning opportunities and exposure for the mission planners, controllers and air defenders, and will go a long way in enhancing and enriching their operational employment. I urge all players to take full advantage of this opportunity. Most of all, I hope the exercise will generate a great measure of lasting goodwill and friendship at all ranks and levels.
