

Speech by Incoming Chief of Defence Force, Major-General Ng Chee Meng at the Chief of Defence Force Change of Command Parade

Minister for Defence, Senior Minister of State, Distinguished Guests, Men and Women of the SAF,

I would like to join General Neo Kian Hong in thanking all of you for your presence this afternoon to witness this symbolic handing over of the SAF command.

We will strengthen our capabilities to ensure that our soldiers, sailors and airmen are equipped with the best systems for them to carry out their mission. Our Active and NS forces will continue to go through tough, realistic and safe training. We will also strengthen our tribe by growing our shared sense of pride and purpose. Our Commanders and senior enlisted leaders will continue to own People Development for the people they lead. In so doing, we will strengthen our foundation for mission success for many years to come.

I am proud of the SAF that we have today, and I am grateful for the many who have served before us on whose shoulders we stand today. Looking ahead, it is my honour and privilege to serve alongside all of you, as we enhance the peace and security of our country.
