

SPEECH BY H.E. THE YANG DI-PERTUAN NEGARA,  
TUN YUSOF BIN ISHAK, AT THE ANNUAL DINNER

My wife and I have great pleasure to be present here to-night at yet another annual dinner of the Malaysian Orchid Society. This dinner, I understand, has an added significance in that it is purposely held at this time of the year to coincide with the Malaysia day celebrations.

As an orchid enthusiast myself, I have followed with keen interest the activities of the Malaysian Orchid Society and it is most heartening to learn from your President, Mr. Chay Sing Hai, about the achievements of the Society for the past year. The 4th World Orchid Conference was certainly the most outstanding event in the history of the Malaysian Orchid Society. With able and dedicated leadership, I have no doubt that the Malaysian Orchid Society will soar to even greater heights of achievements.

Needless to say my wife and I have thoroughly enjoyed ourselves at this sumptuous dinner.
