Perhaps it is with this object in view that 'GESAS' has organised this sepak raga tournament as its contribution to the National Language Week. 'GESAS' is the only sports organisation that is taking part in this year's National Language Week activities, and I feel happy and extend my congratulations to the leaders of 'GESAS' for this.
