SINGAPORE COVERNMENT PRESS STATEMENT

SPIECH BY MR. WEE TOON BOOH, MINISTER OF STATE (DEFENCE) AT THE PRESENTATION OF PRIZES FOR THE DONATION DRAW OF THE NATIONAL SAFETY FIST COUNCIL AT 5.30 P.M. ON WEDNESDAY, 6.3.68. AT A.A. ASSOCIATION, 336 RIVER VALLEY ROAD.

I am extremely pleased to be here today at the presentation of prizes for the Donation Draw of the Safety First Council. By its activities the Council has made and will continue to make invaluable contributions of great social and civic value to our people. The responsibility of a citizen covers many facets of his life, one of the mest important of which is the need for safety consciousness.
