Perhaps, the small man will be attracted by the bright appearance of this office to deposit his savings for safe custody. No doubt the bright appearance of the office will act as an inducement to the needy industrialists to come and seek overdrafts!

To those that seek overdrafts, I have one word of advice: The banker has, sometimes, been described as one who lends money to a person to enable him to buy an umbrella for the rainy day but who will recall the umbrella on the very day it rains! I am sure this description will not apply to the Chartered Bank in Singapore as Mr. Sutherland looks the soul of kindness itself.
