SPEECH BY PRESIDENT ONG TENG CHEONG AT THE ST JOHN'S AMBULANCE BRIGADE PARADE-CUM-INVESTITURE ON SUNDAY 31 AUGUST 1997 AT 5.30 P.M. AT THE SERANGOON STADIUM
