Speech of Mr. Lim Guan Hoo, Political Secretary, Finistry of Mome Affairs at the 7th Intake Fassing Out Farade of Districts 1, 2, 6 and 7, Vigilante Corps at 5.00 p.m. at 12 PDF Camp, Maig Road, Saturday, 26th June, 1971

It is an honour and privilege for me to be present here this evening to inspect the Passing Out Parade of the 7th intake of Vigilante Corps National Servicemen. I must say I am very impressed by your smart turn out and the touch of ruggedness pervading the parade. It is therefore your duty to see that the good that has been done is not undone and the evils which have been annihilated are not resuscitated.

Very soon you will be going for your post basic training; and this time, the emphasis will be on leadership. The training may appear tough but judging from the determination and diligence which you have displayed over the last six months, I am confident that you will just sail through this post basic phase successfully.

Finally, I would like to congragulate all prize winners for their superb performance. Last but not least I wish to give credit to all officers and men for planning, and all Maticinal Servicemen for putting up such an impressive parade.
