SPEECH BY DR TAY ENG SOON, MINISTER OF STATE FOR EDUCATION, AT THE RIVER VALLEY CONSTITUENCY NATIONAL DAY CELEBRATION DINNER AT THE RIVER VALLEY COMMUNITY CENTRE ON SATURDAY, 6 AUGUST 1988 AT 7.30 PM

I am very pleased to be present at tonight's dinner.
Our dinner tonight has two special meanings.

First of all, we are of course celebrating our 23rd Mational Day. Secondly, this will be the last National Day celebration for River Valley Constituency. As you know, after the next general elections, River Valley Constituency will be no more. It will be absorbed into Cairnhill and Tanglin Constituencies.

Remember that the government can only be as good as the people elected into Parliament - no more, no less.

Let me now say a few words about River Valley Constituency. I have been your MP for the past eight years. The grassroot leaders and I have tried our best to serve the residents of River Valley. I am especially grateful to the grassroot leaders who have loyally helped me during these eight years.

River Valley Constituency was formed in 1959.

Before that, it was part of Cairnhill. The Margaret Drive area was part of Tanglin before 1976. These two sections are now returning to Cairnhill and Tanglin. In a sense, history has turned full circle. My Party has not yet decided where I will be standing. I hope my new constituency will not be far from here! I have got to know so many of you as my friends. It will be sad to see River Valley disappear. Nevertheless, may I wish all of you all my best wishes when you join the two new constituencies.
